"All things work together for good" The Story of Joseph

Outline of Genesis 39:1-23

1) Verses 1-6a Joseph is sold as a slave. Joseph is successful as a house manager. "The LORD was with Joseph" (verses 2, 3) 2) Verses 6b-12 Joseph is seduced. Joseph resists seduction. (He leaves his garment behind) 3) Verses 13-16 Joseph is falsely accused. (Potiphar's wife also accuses her husband to "the men of the house") Verses 17-20 Joseph is put in prison. 4) (Potiphar's wife also accuses her husband to his face!) 5) **Verses 21-23** Joseph is successful as a prison leader. "The LORD was with Joseph" (verses 21, 23)

The Joseph story encourages our reflection on these questions: How do we see power at work in the world around us? Who has the power? How do they use it? Whom does it benefit? How do we see power misused? Who are the powerless? How have they become disempowered? How might they be empowered? In what relationships are you relatively powerful or powerless? How do you use express your power?
