

It has been said that "familiarity breeds contempt." If that wording feels a

bit harsh, perhaps we might say that familiarity can certainly foster complacency or carelessness. It's like assuming that all of the controls on my new car should work just like they did on the old car. And forgetting that things have changed since my last car purchase. Or backing out of my driveway so often the same way that I forget to look each time. And suddenly realizing that I've backed into a car that has never been parked there before.

Perhaps seeing something one way for so long that we fail to notice important details that help define that place or person in other important ways. I once lived near an intersection that had a stop sign from the north side-street but not on the south side. This meant that I always drove through that intersection looking south to make sure that that direction was clear. I had driven there for several years when I clearly remember my first close look at what was on the *other* side of that corner—a unique white, two-story house with red shutters and front door that I had never really "seen" before.

The same can be true of reading the Bible. A new context or experience can bring a whole new meaning to a certain verse or passage. Reading it from a different translation or listening to other people explain that scripture can shed new light on what this passage might mean to me in the days ahead. I suspect, also, that our recent Bible reading has brought new understandings even to some of our favorite texts. And will continue to do so as we make our way through the New Testament. This is all part of the joy of discovery as we explore the eternal self-revelation of God to us, his children.

This is why the leadership of our church has decided to follow up with a study this fall called "The Twelve Scriptures Project." It was introduced at one of our annual assemblies and has become very popular especially during "The Year of the Bible." It begins with a survey of everyone in the congregation of the verses or scripture passages that has been most meaningful or formative in their life. The 12 passages that are mentioned the most often are then covered in sermons, small group discussions or other ways to better understand what scriptures have most helped shape our particular congregation.

I encourage you to identify your most influential scriptures and submit the book, chapter, verse(s), and even the translation if you wish, into a special box on the table in the fellowship hall. Our Worship Commission isn't asking for your name, just your most formative passages. No one knows which 12 passages will come out on top, but even if mine aren't selected, just reflecting on why they have been so important to me will be an opportunity for gratitude, growth and new insights into God's living Word.

The deadline for submitting your selections will be Sunday, July 19, so that our pastors, teachers, visual artists and worship planners can prepare to launch this on the first Sunday of September. Watch for the reminders and turn in your selections before you go on vacation or this slips your mind. I look forward to this lead up to Advent, and pray that you will have a safe, enjoyable summer. Shalom!

We hope to resolve those questions in the near future realizing we don't want to rush into hasty decisions.

**Part II of** *From Jesus to Christ: The First Christians* (PBS, 2003) We see the early years of Christianity through the eyes of 12 scholars from various faiths as they explain historical evidence and archaeological finds and may even challenge our understandings of the church. Chapters: The First Followers, The Spread of Christianity, Jews and Gentiles, Peter and Paul, Building the Church, The First Revolt. (51 min.)

July 12: 1-2 Corinthians. Camp Mennoscah Retreat. No Sunday school at church.

July 19: Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians *Peter Dyck: Storyteller.* 6 stories told by Peter J. Dyck, who served our church as pastor from 1950-57. Stories include "Expect a Miracle" which describes Peter J. and Elfrieda's efforts to get post-WWII refugees out of wartorn Germany. Check out his bio on Wikipedia and read their book *Up from the Rubble* (Herald Press, 1991). (1 hr.)

July 26: 1-2 Thessalonians, 1-2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon "The Apostle Paul" from *The Christian Traveler*. We will visit places where Paul traveled to spread the Gospel of Christ, including Jerusalem, Antioch, Philippi, Athens, Corinth, Ephesus and Rome. (Reader's Digest, 2011) (1 hr.)

## Mennonite Disaster Service Brewster, WA, project opens



Region IV began project in Brewster,

Washington, following last summer's devastating wildfires that consumed over 256,108 acres (nearly 400 square miles).

The first fire was started on July 8 by lightning. Another lightning storm moved through the Methow Valley on July 14 and started more fires. Four fires grew into one larger fire on July 20, 2014, the Carlton Complex Fire. Hot weather and high winds pushed the fire over the ridge tops and into the towns of Pateros and Brewster, resulting in a large number of evacuations.

By July 18 the fire had consumed over 300 homes and outbuildings. Many people lost their homes, all their personal possessions, orchards, livestock, fencing and their hope.

Region IV has begun restoration efforts beginning in Brewster and Malott, Washington. The first two houses are being completed by MDS Washington Unit. In the fall this project will be continued as a binational project.

Week one (June 1-5) was a busy week getting work started. Both homes have had foundations, framing and dry-in completed by Amish partners. Region IV will be completing the homes from siding through interior finishing. We are hopeful that both of these homes will be completed by the end of July.



Thank you to all who supported me in the 2015 Run For Relief for MCC. The number of entrants this year was 324. The oldest one was 80 years and the youngest were two 4 year olds. A total of \$21,815 was raised by participants.


#### Save the Date




## What you need:

- 3. Pour into cup. Add ice and fish. Enjoy!


