What's in a name?

The year was 1986 and I found myself in a hospital bed waiting for our son to be born. The problem was that he was due in August but it was only May. The medical staff tried to keep me pregnant as long as possible and I was in week three of being in bed. Finally the day came when the baby had to be delivered on June 6 (ten weeks early). The next month and a half was

spent visiting the NICU unit holding our son and juggling wires attached to his little body. Now came the question of what to name him.

Why are names so important? Where I grew up (Pretty Prairie), people were given nicknames that pointed to their family heritage, personalities, or even perceptions people had about them. Perhaps these were not always help-ful. But in one way or another, nicknames did give people an identity.

As I laid in the hospital bed for several weeks, I must admit I wasn't even thinking of names. My stress had turned to anger. I was angry about everything including things from my past as well as the situation I had before me. So, I expressed my anger in the most pitiful way to God. I told God I didn't have any gifts and if this baby was not to live, I didn't want to live either. What a pity party I was having for myself. But then an amazing thing happened. I heard in my "heart voice" these words: "When are you going to live as a beloved daughter of God?" What? No one I knew talked about being a "beloved daughter" of God. Where was this coming from?

In the months that passed, those words became clear to me. Fast forward to a Lenten service held by the Zion (Elbing) and the Grace Hill Churches two years later. Palmer Becker was speaking about the Hesston College Pastoral Ministries program and after the service I was nudged to tell him I was interested in enrolling. During the next two years, my gifts were affirmed even though I was still denying that I was going to be a pastor. Then I received a book from one of the instructors by Henri Nouwen called *Life of the Beloved*. As I read this book, tears began to flow as Nouwen wrote that God's words to Jesus at his baptism are the words God also speaks to us. "*You are my beloved in whom I am well pleased*." I knew then that the words I heard in that hospital bed were from the Holy Spirit reminding me of God's desire to be in relationship with me (and others). I could only respond by embracing that love in my life.

In Isaiah 43 we read some intimate words that God speaks to us: "*Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.*" Wow. Even God has named us. God has given us an identity as the "beloved" of God. What does that mean in terms of how we live our lives? How can we gratefully respond to God's love for us?

In the days after our son was born (2 lbs. 4 oz.), we did come up with a name – Joshua David Andres. Joshua means "God saves." He is a vibrant thirty-year-old today with a child of his own. We realized that not all babies in the NICU survived even though some of them looked healthier than Josh. That mystery is one we continue to live with today. For those who have lost children by death, there is a pain deeper than words can describe. God weeps with those who weep. Our hope is that in the midst of our deepest pain, God is there and is big enough to receive our anger, doubts, and frustrations. One name I heard recently for God was the "Great Allower." God seems free

enough to allow pain and sorrow to enter our lives and trusts we are free enough to receive love, grace, mercy, peace, and forgiveness in those difficult times. What names would you use for God?

In some upcoming Sundays in August and September, Pastor Derek and I will be preaching on the topic "Names for God." We pray these names will help us understand this intimate God who calls us into relationship and give us hope that we can live as beloved sons and daughters.

The Eden Leadership Team met Thursday, July 21, at the church office at 7:00 p.m.

Present were: Bret Gillmore, JoLene Kaufman, Carol Zerger, Bill Zerger, Jay Goering, Marcy Schrag, Brenda Dalke, June Krehbiel, Perry Krehbiel, Jill Zerger, Kyle Neufeld, and Jean Regier.

Absent were: Pastor Derek and Pastor Karen.

Bret called the meeting to order. For opening devotions Bret read the Hymn "Help us to help each other" from the Mennonite Hymnal page #362. He lit the candle to represent the presence of the Holy Spirit.

The minutes were approved as printed.

During the month of June we had a meeting online due to Harvest. There was consent on the following items:

1. Purchase a \$50.00 gift card to Faith and Life Bookstore and a plant for Pastor Lee and Di's farewell.

2. Approved the updated and revised Job Descriptions.

3. Agreed to pay the full registration cost for Delegates to WDC.

4. Hire Karen Andres to fill the Interim Associate Pastor position on a 3/4 time basis.

Treasurer Report

This is as of July 21, 2016. Revenue: \$202,797.54 Expenses: \$247,793.27 Difference: (\$44,995.73

The spending has been very close to what was budgeted. The staff costs will be less the second half of the year because Pastor Karen is 3/4 time whereas Pastor Lee was full time.

The budget funds still have a balance of \$93,773.79 even though we are down on revenue. We have made 3 mission payments already. There is a breakfast this Sunday for Katie Gillmore and Jay will have the numbers for the costs for Katie and Renae to let people know where we are with their costs. The \$5,800.00 has already been sent for Renae.

Deacon Commission

They met July 11. They gave out three camp scholarships. The issue of how the congregation felt about same sex marriage was talked about. Pastors Derek and Karen will have some discussions with the Deacons first to decide how to go forward with this issue. October 2 is World Communion.

Trustee Commission:

The Trustees toured the church office building to decide how to improve the building. They have decided to remodel the office and Bill will draw up some plans.

Leroy Koehn will be doing the caulking of the joints, hopefully, in the next two weeks.

They discussed the carpet in the choir loft. They will clean a small section to see if that helps, if not then it should probably be replaced with hard wood.

They also discussed replacing the labels on the cemetery directory with brass plates. Gary will look into this. Two posts need to be put on both sides of the south driveway to the cemetery to prevent driving on a gravestone.

Peace/Witness Commission

They are working on getting funding for Renae and Katie for their voluntary service projects. There will be a send-off breakfast for Katie Gillmore and at a later date for Renae.

The Eden Mugs are in and are \$7.50 each. They will be there Sunday.

Worship Commission

The projector proposal will be addressed later in this meeting.

They will be doing piggy banks for new babies along with the picture in front of the sanctuary to honor the new arrivals.

Stewardship Commission

They will be meeting with the Pastors on August 1 to talk about Stewardship Education.

Christian Education/Discipleship Commission

They are finding teachers for the Junior S.S. department for the 2016-2017 year which begins September 4. They are planning a meal for the new and current teachers on August 21.

Wednesday nights begin September 28 - November 16. Two of the nights will be service nights. Pastor Karen will lead Adult Bible Study. Would like volunteers to serve meals those nights There will be a safe sanctuary document at the next ELT meeting to keep our children and youth safe from abuse both within our church facility and at church-sponsored activities away from the church. They look forward to a strong affirmation of the document by ELT.

Pastor Karen

The last 2 1/2 weeks at Eden have been a bit of a whirlwind but positive experiences. Visitation has been the prominent activity so far until the funeral of Harold Schrag this week.

I made 19 visitations including Pine Village, Schowalter Villa and Kidron-Bethel and 1 home visit. I have attended worship at Eden twice and attended Camp Mennoscah. In charge of worship leading last Sunday and helped with worship at Camp. Officiated at the memorial and graveside service for Harold Schrag. I wrote the leading article for the *Eden Echoes*, attended a Deacon's meeting and met with one gentleman in my office regarding a personal concern. Will be taking an already planned vacation to Colorado from July 28 -31. This was planned months in advance.

Projector Proposal

Gib Burgan representing the Video Committee shared that the projector is dying. It is 20 years old. The approximate cost of a new 8000 lumen projector is \$6,640.00 and the lens is \$2,500.00 for a total of \$9,140.00. The picture quality would improve a lot.

The Worship Commission proposes that we go with this projector and use the screen we have. Motion Carried.

Camp Mennoscah fees

The Deacons provided camp scholarships for 4 young people. They want to continue doing that.

Eden weekend at Camp registration was \$113.00 short of what was needed. The ELT expenditures included the camp weekend expenses. **Camp Mennoscah is under Peace/Witness Commission but it was decided to move it to Worship Commission. ELT approved the move.**

Updated MOU's for Pastors

Pastor Derek's Salary. He is responsible for his own insurance according to the Affordable Care Act. We have increased his salary to allow for that. An amount just short of \$10,000.00 for his health and dental are included in his \$60,491.76 salary. \$18,000.00 of Pastor Derek's base salary is designated as housing and utility allowance to reduce what is taxable. The amount for Continuing Education and Continuing Growth is close to the amount recommended by the conference guidelines.

Pastor Karen's MOU

Health care insurance and housing allowance wasn't needed for her. \$36,934.94 is her 3/4 time salary. It was decided to indicate a number for pension allowance rather than a percentage. SCRT will check numbers and come up with that figure and round it up to nearest \$100.00 or \$50.00.

ELT approved the MOU's with the changes made to the Pension plan. Motion carried.

With Pastor Derek receiving a 98% approval from the congregation, WDC, Bret and Derek decided we don't need a review for Derek at this time. We may later do something for him to get feedback. ELT should review his performance at 1 1/2 to 2 years.

Guidelines for paying guest speakers

The figures were \$75.00 for a sermon and \$50.00 for the S.S. hour. These were from a number of years ago. Bret will contact Heidi Regier Kreider concerning that and also ask for suggestions for guest speakers for the Sundays Derek or Karen do not preach.

New Business

We need to approve the Vision/Mission Statement.

Education/Discipleship Commission will have a Safe Sanctuary Proposal next month.


