Worship and the Theater

Worship is like the theater...

That might seem pretty obvious. If you sit in the sanctuary of most churches and look around, you'll see theater-like seating, all pointed toward the front. The front usually includes a raised area, which in the past was called a "chancel," but is now quite commonly called a "stage." When worship (the show) begins, the congregation (audience) gathers and finds seating on the

benches. They check their bulletins (programs) to see what will be happening and who is involved. Then, after a prelude (pre-show music) a worship leader or pastor (actors) steps

to the microphone to begin the worship (show). After a particularly moving piece of special music (solo), the congregation (audience) may burst into applause. For the average observer, it's not much of a stretch to see some basic similarities between what happens in churches on Sunday morning and what happens in a theater on a Friday or Saturday night.

So as I was doing my research on worship for the elective Sunday school class, it didn't strike me as odd to come across this sentence: "Many theologians join Kierkegaard in comparing worship to the theater." Marva Dawn highlights this metaphor, but goes on to explain that Kierkegaard was offering a renewed understanding of who the characters in the theater should be. This shift is what caught my attention. According to Kierkegaard, we enter the sanctuary and assume that we are the theatergoers and the people up front are the actors. He asserts that in worship, God is the audience, the people on the chancel are the prompters, and the people in the congregation are the actors. Kierkegaard says, "In the most earnest sense God is the critical theatergoer...The speaker then is the prompter, and the listener stands openly before God. The listener, if I may say so, is the actor, who in all truth acts before God." So Dawn concludes that "genuine worship happens when everyone knows that God is the audience."

This metaphor could be very challenging to many of us, and I hope it is. I realize that no metaphors are perfect, so I understand that this one could steer us in the wrong direction. At its worst, it could scare us off from wanting to worship at all because it makes us think that we are in the spotlight and God is simply watching us perform while God snacks on popcorn. This image is wrong in so many ways, primarily because in worship God is be the center of all we do and say, the one who captures the focus of our eyes, our hearts, and our very lives. Additionally, it is important to recognize that the only reason we are gathered for worship at all is that God was, is, and always will be the primary Actor. The only reason there is worship is in response to God's saving work, so while the congregation may be the actors, that is only a response to God's acting in the first place. I loved basketball as a kid, but my excitement went to another level when I watched Michael Jordan. In the 1991 NBA Finals, he made a move, forever burned into my brain, in which he went down the lane, took off to dunk the ball with his right

hand, then, to avoid the defenders, switched the ball to his left hand and made a scooping layup just before landing. I spent the next several weeks practicing that very move night and day, trying to do it just like him. Jordan made a move that inspired me so much that I couldn't help but respond. So the metaphor of the theater in which we are the actors is helpful, we must remember who acted first.

At its best, this theater metaphor reminds us that in worship we are not simply passive recipients of a stage production, but actors responding to God's goodness, with prompting from organists, choirs, pastors, and worship leaders. The image of worship in Revelation highlights the active participation of everyone present: "...there was a great multitude that no one could count... standing before the throne... with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God, who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Ch. 7 Vs. 9,10) Our worship here should be an attempt to practice for, or get a glimpse of our eternal worship in God's throne room, in which everyone has an active part in the choruses of praise.

Ask yourself, if in worship I am an actor and God is the audience, does it matter where I sit? Does it matter if I sing or not? How might a shift in perception of who the actors are and who the audience is change my focus and my actions in worship?

Pastoral Search Committee Update

The Search Committee met several times in May and spent considerable time in thoughtful discussion and prayer with the end result being the following document/announcement made to first ELT and then to the congregation. We currently have an individual who has accepted the invitation to be the candidate for Lead Pastor at Eden. He has agreed to go through the steps toward a congregational vote. This is the announcement that was made June 5, 2016.

It is with great joy that we announce that we have a Candidate for Lead Pastor!

This has been a long and interesting journey, sometimes quite difficult, but we believe that we have followed the direction of the Spirit at each step in the process.

The young man that we have asked to be the candidate for lead pastor is, we believe, a good fit for Eden. He is very gifted, he is steeped in Anabaptist Theology, he has a great deal of enthusiasm and energy for ministry, and he loves the church. He shows a deep maturity and professionalism, he is passionate about ministry, gifted musically, and is already invested in Eden Mennonite.

Many person from the congregation have mentioned from the beginning that Derek would be an excellent lead pastor, and we have always agreed, but had some hesitancy simply because he had only been here a short time, he was doing an amazing job with the work of Associate Pastor, and seemed at home in that role. We felt it was not fair to him to pull him away from that, in spite of the fact that we knew he would do an excellent job as Lead Pastor.

This year and a half of work on our part has given him time to work at what he was hired to do, and his performance in that time has only served to solidify what we thought from the beginning...that he will do well with wherever God places him!

Because a transition of position can be a bit touchy, we want to make sure to do this thoughtfully and with care. We have visited with Heidi Regier Kreider at Western District Conference, and have prayerfully discerned that this is certainly a viable option for our congregation.

We will need to do some altering of job descriptions, so that the distinctive 'lead pastor's responsibilities (such as calling staff meetings, speaking with the media, and being the place where 'the buck stops') are transferred into Derek's job description, but will also allow him to continue his excellent work with FEWZ and the young adults in the congregation. SCRT, ELT Executive Committee, and the Search Committee will be meeting with Derek to clarify his role as lead pastor.

As unnecessary as it may seem to some, we will need to follow the proper procedure, and propose a candidating weekend at a date in the near future. Derek will be available to answer any questions that small groups, committees, or individuals may have in regards to his perception of this new position, his vision for the church, etc. He will also preach a 'candidating' sermon, and we will hold a congregational meeting to vote the following week. Thanks for your patience and your prayers.

In the days following the congregational announcement there was a meeting of the Search Committee, ELT, SCRT to discuss issues of transitioning Associate Pastor to Lead Pastor, specific changes to the job descriptions involved, and specifics of a "candidating" weekend, which was chosen to be June 18-19.

The Search Committee elected to have our new Lead Pastor Candidate, Derek King, have breakfast and a round table discussion session early Saturday morning, June 18. Eden Mennonite Church members were invited to attend. The weekend also included Derek's sermon on Sunday morning, June 19, followed by congregational /pastor questions and answers during the Sunday School hour.

Sunday, June 26 there was a congregational vote for members to vote on accepting Derek King as Lead Pastor for Eden Mennonite Church. The results were 180 - yes and 2- no. As a committee, we feel God has blessed us with a wonderful "gift" in our midst. We thank you, the congregation, for your ongoing input, support, and prayers which helped lead us in the path we have chosen. We will continue as a committee to secure the position of Associate Pastor in the coming days.




Celebrate summer with this tasty dessert pizza, using your favorite summer fruits as the toppings. Λ

- Knife
