Listen to the Lord as He speaks softly Listen to the words of a perfect man Listen to the miracle of God incarnate Listen even when you don't understand.

This is a song I grew up singing at Camp Hebron, a Mennonite camp in Pennsylvania. Usually, we would sing it in a round, so there was a mesmerizing rhythm at the beginning when all you heard was *Listen to the*,

Listen to the, Listen to the, Listen to the. I have always loved this song because of the simple, repetitive reminder to *listen*. I fear that in our move towards social media communication we have lost our ability to listen. Information comes at us quickly and the newest story is being told before the oldest one is even an hour old. Instead of taking the time to really dive deep into the news stories or even our friends' stories, we take a quick scan and move on. I'm concerned that our brains will continue to be rewired to prefer this method of information gathering, so we will read the Bible this way as well. My hope is that we realize that God speaks through the Bible and particularly through our communal reading and discernment of scripture, but only if we truly listen. Real listening takes time and practice, but if it deepens our connection to God and to each other, then I believe it is all worth it.

Recently our Deacons have begun setting aside time during their monthly meetings to read the Bible together and to listen. The purpose of these times is to center ourselves, as a discerning body, on the living Word of God. The goal is to become spiritual shepherds who are always improving our listening skills, so that we can be more attentive to our church community and the Holy Spirit that moves in our midst.

To frame our practice of listening, we paid attention to three important voices: the Text, the Self, and the Other. This means simply that we 1) read the scripture passage, noting what parts stood out to each of us, 2) explored how our own story may have influenced what stood out to us, and 3) listened to one another share what we were hearing. And I have to say, we had a wonderful time reading the Bible together in this way. I was excited by the energy in the room as pairs of Deacons shared the thoughts and feelings that were stirred in them by the Bible verses, began to explore their own images of God, and listened intently to the other.

What we found in our time together was that each of us were drawn to different words or phrases in the texts. Because of this, we began the difficult process of working through the personal filters we bring with us when we read the Bible. We aim to sift through the personal filters to more clearly discern what the Spirit is saying to us as a gathered body. For example, one person noted that he saw God's ultimate plan being worked out through the creation account in the second chapter of Genesis, while another person noted that she saw God being creative and experimental, not being sure what would come next. Both people agreed that their upbringing probably had an impact on the way they understood the text.

At the end of our time, we hadn't come to any conclusions. We didn't come up with any definitive doctrine or theological assertions. At some point, there may be a time and place for those, but for now we have begun the long, slow process of listening to God's Word, to ourselves, and to each other.

Our faith family has wonderful energy when we gather. We love being together, checking in with each other and sharing our lives. Our challenge is to deepen our relationships. Let us not be content to share and listen just about our day to day lives. May we deepen our connections by listening to God's word together, exploring

more deeply how our own stories are intersecting with God's story. May we take the time to truly listen to the voices of those that matter, our God, ourselves, and each other.

The Eden Leadership Team met Thursday, August 18, 2016 at the Church Office at 7:00 p.m.

Present were: Perry Krehbiel, JoLene Kaufman, Bill Zerger, Carol Zerger, Pastor Karen, Pat Stucky, Bret Gillmore, Brenda Dalke, Kyle Neufeld, Marcy Schrag, Jerry Schrag and Pastor Derek.

Absent were: Jay Goering and Jean Regier

For opening Bret led in prayer. The candle was lit by Jerry to represent the Holy Spirit's presence. The minutes from the last meeting were approved as printed.

Treasurer Report:

Revenue is: \$244,052.11

Expenses are: \$294,663.82

Difference is: (\$50,611.71) The \$26,000.00 is included in that amount so the difference is approximately (\$24,600.00.)

Renae Stucky received \$6,367.70 and Katie received \$3,965.00. Renae needed \$5,800.00 and Katie needed \$3,000.00 so there is more than needed. The excess could be given to Bob and Sondra for their expenses.

Derek commented that it is more important to know how we are doing according to Budget.

The Stewardship Commission told the Commissions not to be too concerned about going a little over their budgeted amount.

Worship Commission

The new projector is in and not working very well. If the temperature gets over 90° the projector won't work. Gib is working on it and consulting with the company.

They discussed the calendar schedule and are looking into guest speakers.

Deacon Commission

They met August 10. Discussed their confidential concerns and prayers. Talked about the on call schedule. Also the Pine Village Service and visitation updates. The last half hour the Pastors are leading a Bible study on how to listen to each other.

Trustees Commission

Becky Clark contacted the Trustees about the use of the organ for an evening. The organ society has used the sanctuary before. They will be revamping the Church Office.

Education/Discipleship Commission

This Sunday, August 21, There will be an appreciation meal for the outgoing and incoming teachers. September 4 starts the new Sunday school year. August 28 they will hand out Bibles to 3rd grade students and to a family with a child that will be in Kindergarten.

The Safe Sanctuary brochure was sent to WDC for them to look over.

September 28 starts Wednesday night. Berni Kaufman will lead the children and Pastor Karen will lead the adults.

Stewardship Commission

They discussed Stewardship training from pulpit or in Sunday School classes. They want to have a 3 year plan for Stewardship education.

October 2 during the S.S. hour there will be a time for discussion about the mission giving. How the unified budget works. They will have a survey to find out where people are wanting to give their money for missions. The survey will be due back in a week.

Pastor Derek

WDC went well. Eden had 4 delegates. There was good discussion around tables about where churches were going. Things in the office have gone really well in his new role and with Pastor Karen.

November 6 Pastor Brad will preach at Eden and Pastor Derek will preach at West Zion. He will work with Pastor Laura in the spring for a pulpit exchange with First Mennonite.

There were 245 at the Pine Village service and only 10 from Pine Village were non-members.

Pastor Karen

She met with SCRT. They approved 1 Sunday off a month. She will have 2 off this month. She averages 5 visitations a day in the afternoon. Working with Pastor Derek on worship schedule. She is planning a Friday lunch with women who work outside the home in Moundridge.

Trustees Church Office Proposal

Bill showed us plans for the renovation of the office. It would involve only interior work, no structure work. The outside would be re-caulked and painted. Discussion followed.

Vision/Mission Statement

They are envisioning a potential of using it as a guiding statement. The Commissions need to put this on their agenda each time they meet. The question could be asked, "How does what we're doing reference the Vision

Statement"? Maybe some art work could set the stage for 2017. That could give us direction to kick off the new year.

Question: Why doesn't the Vision Statement start with to be? It was decided to keep it the way it reads.

Question: Doesn't it sound better to read "in all we say and do" rather than "in all we do and say"?

The consensus was to change it to "say and do" and also to list the Vision Statement first and then the Mission Statement.

On a daily basis, how do we use these statements? Use it as a guideline at the Commission meetings and ELT to help us decide which agenda items are of top priority and which are not. It needs to be put in newspaper and also on the website.

Question: Do we need the words 'through us" in Vision Statement? We are instruments of God's grace and peace. We decided to leave it in.

ELT affirmed the statements with the 2 changes. Pastor Derek will put a short article in the *Eden Echoes* to understand how the church can use that statement.

Student Grant Scholarships

The Stewardship Commission brought this recommendation to the ELT:

The Stewardship Commission recommends the Student Grant Scholarships be increased to \$1,000.00 per semester beginning January 2017.

ELT approved unanimously.

New Business

Bret is working on updating the Constitution. He will present it to the ELT Executive for review. We promised to have the Constitution written by the end of the year. He could send it to the ELT to review but it was decided to let Executive review it first.

It was suggested that Eden put an article in the *Mennonite Weekly Review* to let people know what's happening at Eden.

WDC is holding a Reference Council in Dallas in October. ELT would be willing to help with funding for someone to go.

Katie Gillmore is going to be the new blogger for *The Mennonite*.

Meeting adjourned at 8:37 p.m.

Thanks again for all those who offered input and feedback as we discerned a meaningful Vision and Mission for Eden Mennonite Church. These statements were recently approved by Eden Leadership Team. I am really excited to move forward with these statements in the life of our faith community. So let me briefly answer two questions that may still be rolling around in your head: **Why?** and **What now?**

I believe that any movement needs to have some clarity about what their end-goal looks like and a basic identity. Our vision is a simple, yet rich picture of people living in the abundant life of Jesus Christ. It is a hope that we can all be formed in Christ's likeness so that our prayer can be made a reality: God's Kingdom come and God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Our mission, then, states who we are and what we do to be able to make our vision a reality.

My hope is that these statements can be helpful reminders and guides for all of our life together as a family of faith. For example, I am encouraging each of our Commissions to put these statements at the top of every meeting agenda for the next year. I get thrilled to think that as our leaders meet to do the "business" of the church that they are asking of every agenda item, every conversation, and every decision, "How is this helping us achieve our vision? Is this consistent with our mission of being a Jesusfollowing community?" Might our Commissions feel empowered to spend more time in scripture and prayer if we are attempting to follow Jesus in everything?

Perhaps you sit in worship on a particular Sunday morning, exhausted from the week and wondering what you are even doing here when there is so much to do at home. I would love to think that you might take note of our Vision and Mission and be inspired to let go of your concerns for a moment to join in the community's practice of rest and worship, so that you and those sitting around you may be made new in the presence of our Lord. Maybe someone asks about your church and you have seen the Vision and Mission enough that you can easily say, "Well we're a community that tries to follow Jesus in all we say and do. We hope this leads to the whole world knowing God's peace and love." Or something like that.

The Vision and Mission is currently on the website and we plan to have it printed in every bulletin for the next year. We may even have a series of worship services focusing on them in the near future. I give thanks to God that I am part of a faith community that attempts to live out its faith in meaningful ways. May we allow ourselves to be formed into Jesus' likeness and be led by the Holy Spirit to deliver God's love to the world around us.

The 'art' of forgiveness

An interesting legend is associated with the painting "The Last Supper." Some say Leonardo da Vinci used a rival's face for Judas. Then when the painter tried to create Jesus' face, all he could see was that of his enemy. Supposedly, da Vinci was able to complete Jesus' face — and the entire masterpiece — only after making peace with his enemy and repainting Judas.

This tale shows the necessity of forgiving other people so we can accept Jesus' forgiveness for ourselves. As Jesus says in Matthew 6:14-15 (NIV), "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."

What you need:

- A large round bowl
- 2 large pieces of construction paper
- A pen
- Scissors
- A ruler
- A brad
- A Bible or search engine

What you do:

- 1. Turn the bowl upside down and trace around it on both pieces of paper.
- 2. Cut out the circles. Draw a dot in the center of each.
- 3. On one circle, trace and cut out two 2" squares opposite each other, with the dot in the middle.
- 4. Align the dots and place the brad through both circles.

- 6. Rotate the circle to a new blank space, and write another fear and verse.
