Does God judge, or does God extend mercy?

I've heard the complaints of people wrestling with the existence of God, many of them being based on apparent contradictions. "How can God be all-loving and all-powerful while bad things happen every day? God must be

one or the other, but can't be both." "How can God be both judging and merciful, it doesn't make sense." These are difficult questions for which I don't pretend to have

good answers. These are questions that lead many to doubt God's existence, or at least the god as proclaimed by many Christians. So they are questions that we need to wrestle with. I am confident that most of us have wrestled with these in some way along our faith journeys, and probably still do.

One way to respond to these apparent contradictions is to emphasize one over the other. So, on the question of God's sovereignty vs. human free will, we tend towards one side, proclaiming either that God is ultimately in charge and directs the course of human events, or that humans have been given free reign to do as they please while God watches and waits from afar. Does God judge, or does God extend mercy? It seems easier to imagine one or the other. Either God righteously judges between good and evil or God's grace "covers a multitude of sins." It seems in our nature to hold to the simplest vision of God we can manage. I don't think that's a bad thing. To understand our complicated world, we cope by finding categories for everything and everyone, so that we can distinguish the "good guys" from the "bad guys." Those of us that had somewhat picturesque childhoods had a really hard time coping when we first realized that our parents made mistakes and were less than perfect. We long for simple explanations of the world, of ourselves, and especially of God.

I believe that Scripture reveals God to us in a way that defies simplification. Is God revealed as judging or loving? Yes. Does God have a plan for us, or has God given us choices? Yes. Is God the same yesterday, today, and forever, or can God have a change of heart? Yes. Is God described as male or female? Yes. Did Jesus come to unify or divide? Yes. Are the faithful called to suffering or to abundant life? Yes.

Unfortunately, it seems that the apparent contradictions and simplified answers have led many to abandon God's word altogether. I recognize the difficulty in holding together these complicated images that seem to butt heads. But I hope our response to the reality of a complicated revelation is further engagement. While our brains might desire simple images of God, don't we also love a good, complex story with complicated characters? The Bible is rich with complicated stories that can provide us with new and different insights about God and our world, while contributing to the consistent overall message of God's love and care for all of creation. The Bible disturbs our simple answers and preset assumptions so that we ourselves might be transformed on a daily basis. While we read God's words, God's Word reads us.

The best news of all is that we do not have to engage this all on our own. In the ultimate act of love and solidarity with God's people and the complexities of this world, Jesus "took the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness." (Phil. 2:7) Jesus came to be present in the realities of this world, to show that God still reigned, despite what our eyes perceived. So Jesus proclaimed a great big YES to the question, "Is the Kingdom here, or is it yet to come?" And recognizing the complications that means for daily life in this "now and still to come" kingdom, Jesus promised to be with the faithful always, "to the end of the age." Jesus' very Spirit came in powerful ways to the early church and is present in powerful ways today.

Let's get to know our Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, the Lord of Heaven and Earth who cannot be contained by our simplified visions or explanations. Let's stand in awe of the One who can at same time be known as judge and merciful, personal and cosmic. And let us give thanks that in the complexity of life, God joins us, to walk the road and guide our steps.

The Eden Congregation met on Sunday, December 11 after a potluck meal.

Bret called the meeting to order and declared

a quorum.

E. Fred Goering from the Gifts Discernment Committee presented the ballot. It read as follows:

When there are two names, that is to fill the open positions, this could vary each year.

The ushers collected the ballots.

Of the 95 ballots counted everyone had a majority vote.

The Stewardship Commission presented the budget for 2017. They had input from the Trustees and individual Commissions on their budgets. There was no discussion. It doesn't require a second.

The vote was 84 Yes and 2 No.

The third question before the congregation was the Eden **Church Office Proposal.**

It was presented by the Trustees and approved by the ELT. Questions: What is the thinking behind the private consult office? It will be a flexible space for private counseling. It also could be used as a prayer room. It will have a separate entrance for private access to that room. Where will historical items be stored? They will be kept at the office but will need to be consolidated as much as possible. Did you only have one bid for cost of renovation? They worked on the most efficient plan. They used as many local vendors as possible. A church member is going to look at the electrical and give another bid.

Should Eden Mennonite Church renovate the Church Office? Yes 79 No 10

No other business to come before the congregation. Pastor Derek commented on the year. It has been a good year. He asked for applause for the out-going Commission members. Pastor Dianne and Pastor Derek are working together very well. There will be a new Church Directory. The pictures will be taken in late January and early February.

Joe Lichti moved and Marla Gillmore seconded that the meeting adjourned.

The Eden Leadership Team met Thursday, December 15, 2016 at the church.

Present were: Bret Gillmore, Brenda Dalke, JoLene Kaufman, Jay Goering, Bill Zerger, Carol Zerger, Jerry Schrag, Marcy Schrag, Pastor Dianne Schmidt, Pastor Derek King, Perry Krehbiel, Jean Regier, Morgan Kaufman, and Kyle Neufeld. No one was absent.

Bret read the Vision/ Mission Statement

Jay Goering had the opening. He shared about his MDS work in Saipan. A typhoon destroyed the island in 2015 and the people were all busy on another project so they contacted MDS for help. He led in prayer.

The minutes were approved as printed.

Treasurer Report: The 6th payment for missions has been made. The only thing left is the final staff payment for this year. There are two more Sundays for offering.

Revenue - \$420,684.26

Expenses - \$437,440.69

Difference - (16,756.43)

Budget - \$429,687.00

We approved the debt relief for Pastors. There is money available in WDC. We wrote check for full amount and then will get reimbursed from WDC. This came out of ELT funds.

All other Commissions are right at budget or under.

The MCC Meat Canning funds were paid out for next year. The amount paid out was \$16,643.97.

Question - Want an explanation on the Cetera Investment Services. That is an investment set up when funds were transferred from another fund. Is that money available to draw from? Don't know the answer to that question.

Christian Education/ Discipleship Commission: The

Wednesday night meals start January 18 and run through March 8. Pastor Dianne will be leading a discussion on immigration.

Peace/Witness Commission: They are continuing to work on the church brochures. They are also working on getting a speaker from Texas who deals with immigration. They will set the date soon. If there is someone interested in doing Peace Essays, they would support that also.

Deacon Commission: They met in December for a short meeting at Brandon and Morgan's house. The on call schedule is set for January. Brandon will give summary of this Commission at February business meeting.

Trustee Commission: There is a funeral for a non-member family on Saturday. They came to the conclusion that the cost for use of church would be \$100.00. There has been a bad odor in the office. It is probably due to a dry drain. Poured a lot of water down the drain to see if that helps. The trustees proposal to renovate the church office passed a congregational vote last Sunday, December 11. They will now finalize pricing for the renovation and work with church office staff regarding

scheduling and how best to accommodate the staff during the renovation process. They will probably start on the back half since the most messy work will be back there. They need to schedule people to come in and move their items to a storage place yet to be determined.

Worship Commission: They had the organ tuned by a man from Liberty Missouri. The key for a part of the back of the organ is missing. So only 85% of the organ got tuned this time. Cindy Bartell has access to a key from her sister-in-law. They will have the key for the next time. The best time to tune the organ is in spring.

Stewardship Commission: They presented the budget to the congregation on Sunday, December 11 and it passed 84 yes 2 no. All annual reports are due to the church office by January 8, 2017

Pastor Dianne: It is getting close to two months since she started at Eden. She sits in on Worship Commission and Education/Discipleship Commission meetings. All is going well.

Pastor Derek: The Associated Churches of Moundridge board approved the structure change. They will now rewrite the constitution and rework the make up of the board. They also will hire a part-time Executive Director. The name has been changed to Associated Ministries of Moundridge. The representation on the board will come from the ministries rather than the churches.

Pastor Derek's grant for debt relief was accepted. Eden wrote check to Everence and they will reimburse Eden. Then that will be applied to Pastor Derek's debt. Pastors Derek, Brad and Laura will share baptism duties. There is no one from Eden at the present time to take baptism. They have been working on the theme for the January and February services. The Holy Week Services will be Sunday and Monday with Associated Churches. The subject will be healing and trauma from the cross. The speaker will be a Pastor from the Hesston area talking about trauma since the Excel shootings. Either Eden or West Zion will host.

The Commissions need to chose their ELT representatives and let JoLene know their name and email address a.s.a.p. He thanked Bill and the Trustees for explaining proposal so well

Safe Sanctuary Policy: Pastors will be doing background checks that also includes two lines for reference. It will be done with a third party online and then the information will be shredded. If it passes they will gather all who work with youth for a meeting and explain the policy to them. The cost of the background checks is around \$10.00 - \$12.00 each. They will spread out the background checks over a period of time due to the expense. Kathy Wiens and Dr. Jeanette Harden are available for training. Becky King will help to put in place safety for children as part of S. S. curriculum.

With the changes made do we approve this policy? Yes - 14 No - 0

Constitution Review: Under Article V, Membership line A requirements remove the words and accepts and signs this constitution. Under Article V section D Privileges remove the words All members in good standing shall have full church privileges. Under Line H remove the following; They shall have all the privileges of regular members except those of voting and holding an elected church office, Associate members may hold appointed church positions. Associate members are not counted in conference statistics.

Under Article VII part A the last half of the paragraph should read: Church officers will be those members affirmed by the congregation with a 2/3 majority vote to serve on the ELT Executive Committee and Commissions. Church officers will be nominated by the Gifts Discernment Committee and affirmed by receiving a majority vote by the congregation. When an elected officer is unable to complete their term a replacement will be nominated by the Gifts Discernment Committee and affirmed by a 2/3 majority vote of the ELT.

Under Article X section C remove the line that reads: All elections shall be by ballot. Persons receiving the highest number of votes shall be considered elected. Then in the next sentence remove: Elected and/or appointed.

If someone were to resign mid term ELT could affirm a person by a 2/3 vote to fill out the term.

Deacons and the Pastors will review Articles 3, 4, and 8. and come back with changes.

The constitution will be revised and finished. We will discuss at the next meeting.

Bret thanked Pastor Dianne for sitting in on the meetings with Lifetouch. Peace/Witness will work on activity pages with Bret's help. Bret will get the posters and bulletin inserts up by the end of the month.

The Celebration Sunday will be February 5, 2017.

New Business: Leadership Retreat will be at Whitestone Church in Hesston January 28, 2017 from 9:00 - 3:00. Every officer, ELT member, SCRT, and Gifts Discernment committee members should attend. There will be games, worship and planning.

Next meeting: January 19, 2017. We will try to figure out a time from then on.

Make this cute, healthy snack for your loved ones on Valentine's Day.




What you need:
