# From the Pastor

I've heard it said that there are two types of Christians: the Right kind and the Wrong kind. I'm pretty sure I know what this means. It's obvious to me who are the right kind of Christians and the wrong kind. I can tell by what church they go to, what kind of car they drive, and how they voted

in the last presidential election. I sure you know these types as well. It's fairly easy to tell the difference between the right and wrong Christians. It's probably better that we keep our distance, lest we tragically become associated with the wrong kind of Christian.

It's at this point that I hope you are starting to note the sarcasm. If you just said "Amen!" to the opening paragraph, then please keep reading.

# *The eye cannot say to the hand "I have no need of you," or again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." -1* Corinthians 12:21

When Paul writes to the church in Corinth, he urges them to understand themselves as one body, and each integral members of it. I believe this is a truth of the church today, and not just our church, but the global Christian church. Unfortunately, the reality is that while we are meant to be unified as the body of Christ, we often find our strongest disagreements and divisions between members of the same body.

In her book *Disunity in Christ: Uncovering the hidden forces that keep us apart*, Christena Cleveland addresses the dynamic in which we as Christians often have the hardest time getting along with other types of Christians. Her book is based on a broad spectrum of research in human behavior, highlighting our tendencies to identify with particular groups and distance ourselves from others.

One of the most disheartening parts of Cleveland's research is the finding that exposure to Christian concepts leads people towards positive behavior, but only towards members of their congregation. At the same time, exposure to those concepts leads to increased aggression and support of violence against anyone else. Cleveland writes: "One would hope that Christians who are reminded of their Christian identity would love *all* others more. However, that is not the case." This happens for various reasons, which Cleveland covers in her wonderful book.

I can't summarize everything here, so please read her book, but on a basic level, it is easier and more desirable for us to be around those who are similar to us. This an be helpful because it gives us a sense of identity and belonging and it reaffirms our own concept of ourselves. It keeps us safe and secure. The problem is that it reinforces a very limited view of the world. It maintains assumptions about "us" and "them" and usually leads to hostility against "them."

The good news is that when "they" become "we" in our minds and in practice, "we" start treating each other better. This is why it is crucial that we reinforce in our own minds that for those who are in Christ, there is no "they." "They" may be different *parts* of the Body of Christ, as the metaphor goes, but "we" are *all* members of the same body. It's also important to do the hard work of making meaningful connections with those who are outside of our predictable, comfortable groups. We can talk about being more open to others, but research shows that we have to go through the difficult steps of actually spending time with and getting to know others to make significant changes. Unity is hard work, but it was embodied by Jesus' life and completed by his death on the cross. May we cross the boundaries of liberal/conservative, Democrat/Republican, new member/lifetime member, Eden/Grace, etc. to find and embrace the other parts that make up the whole body of Christ.

The Church Office renovation was not in the budget. \$25,000.00 has been spent so far and \$10,000.00 has been brought in through donations.

The church office renovations are going well. They touched up paint today and will be grouting tile. The counter tops should be here Wednesday or Thursday.

Appliances are still needed.

The meal on June 4 will be a fundraiser for the office renovation. The trustees will cook the brats and hamburgers, congregation members will bring side dishes to accompany the meat, and the Potluck Committee will host the meal.

#### **Stewardship Commission**

Nothing to report. They will meet next month.

#### **Christian Education/ Discipleship Commission**

Bible School will be July 7 - 9. This will be for the community. Morgan Kaufman is the representative for Eden. The offering for the summer Sunday school will be for the Whale Playground project at Camp Mennoscah.

#### **Deacon Commission**

Deacons will be giving Camp scholarships of \$100.00 for each camper.

Communion will be served on June 11.

Deacons have been working on the Constitution review. Berni Kaufman has volunteered to drive a Pine Village resident to church once a month.

#### Worship Commission

The Worship Commission discussed the schedule for the summer services. They had the organ tuned and have been put on a schedule to have it tuned every spring.
