God is Waiting

Waiting. That's what I found myself doing this week, waiting at a doctor's office for an appointment. I had purposely scheduled it early in the morning, arrived promptly, anticipating not having to wait long. When I arrived in the waiting room I was the only one there. This was hopeful - I would be first in line. The nurse came fairly soon and took me to an exam room. She told me that there was just one person ahead of me. I was a bit disappointed that I was second, but thought it shouldn't be too long.

I regretted leaving the magazine I was looking at in the waiting room but I had my phone with me. So, I settled into checking my email and then looking at my Facebook feed, which occupied me for a while. As more minutes passed and I was still waiting, I became more frustrated asking myself, "Why hadn't I at least brought along a book to read for one of my seminary classes? I could have at least made this time productive." As my waiting continued I started making a list in my head of all the things that I needed to do at home and at the office plus thinking ahead to all the things on my schedule for the next week. I did not have time to wait! Finally, after an hour (wondering if I had been forgotten) I stuck my head out of the room and the nurse indicated that perhaps it would only be another 20-30 minutes.

I texted Dennis to express my irritation on having to wait so long. He responded by suggesting that maybe it might be a time that I could pray. Oh...why hadn't I thought of that. To help me focus away from my waiting frustration, I went to the website, *Sacred Space*, which offers prayers and scripture reading for each day. As I clicked on the first page this is the prayer that I read: "At this instant, as I arrive here, God is present **waiting** for me."

I didn't read any further, for God had finally gotten my attention. I had let all my annoyance about waiting, distract me from the gift I had been given. God had been waiting for me. More than an hour of time had been given me which I squandered away considering my work and my agenda to be priorities.

God is present waiting for me and you. How might we make it a priority to spend time with God in listening, pondering, and meditating? One way is to practice spiritual disciplines so that we stay in tune with who God is and what God wants for our world. Creating space to be spiritually refreshed and renewed. Spending focused time in prayer, not only offering our concerns but also listening. Engaging scripture and marinating in it so that it can transform us. Taking a day to fast and discern where God is leading.

One of my assignments for my current seminary class is to spend 20 minutes each day practicing a spiritual discipline. Each week we are given a new discipline to try at least once and invited to use more often if we find it helpful. I've experimented with "praying backward through my day" allowing God to call my attention to something in my day that I need to be grateful for and something that I need to give more thought to. I've used the website I mentioned earlier (sacredspace.ie) to help guide my prayers and mediate on a given scripture text. I've found several new spiritual practices to try through the book, *Sacred Pauses*, by April Yamasaki. She suggests things like Making Music, Having Fun, Valuing Relationships and Praying Scripture. I invite you to join me in trying out some new spiritual disciplines.

Life is full and challenging and we need times of rest and renewal. May we pause and remember that God is present waiting for us.

Eden Leadership Team Minutes

Vision/Mission Statement

Mission: To be a community that follows Jesus in all we say and do.

Vision: A people transformed by the Holy Spirit in worship and service, so that through us God's love and peace are made known to the world.

The Eden Leadership Team met Monday, September 25, at the church office at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Kyle Neufeld, JoLene Kaufman. Pastor Dianne Schmidt, Carina Knight, Becky Koller, Tim Regehr, Gary Regier, Jean Regier, Austin Goering, Jerry Schrag, Pat Stucky and Pastor Derek King.

Absent: Brenda Dalke.

Pastor Derek led in devotions. He referred to Acts 21 and 22. He spoke about Paul's journey to Jerusalem. Which identity do we have when interacting with our neighbors? He led in prayer.

Kyle called the meeting to order and lit the candle to represent the Holy Spirit's presence.

He also read the Vision/ Mission Statement. The minutes were approved as printed.

Treasurer Report

The renovation budget:

We received \$44,000.00 in donations and capital building fund. \$70,000.00 has been spent. There could be approximately another \$1,500.00 in expenses. \$25,000.00 needs to be transferred from the checking account for the renovations.

Our church budget is \$334,000.00 to this point. Expenses: \$378,000.00; Income: \$300,000.00. Last year at this time \$278,000.00; Difference - (\$79,000.00). All mission giving payments have been made.

Deacon Commission Report

Shared congregational cares and concerns.

They discussed Pastoral Review.

Worked on membership part of the Constitution

Plan to pay for food for the church picnic on October 1.

Education Commission

The new Sunday school and Wednesday night programs are moving along nicely.

Stewardship Commission

They have not met since the last ELT meeting.

Do they need permission to have a second person to write checks in Austin's absence? Becky Koller is available for that. The account is still under Jay's name. Austin has the forms to put his name on it. Is there a need for an assistant Treasurer? This would enable the assistant to learn the process so that they are better equipped to take over when Austin's term is over which could be another three years if Austin accepts a second term.

Kyle will discuss this with Gifts Discernment and S.C.R.T.

Peace/Witness Commission

Peace/Witness is currently working to establish an ongoing relationship with the Episcopal Migration Ministries. They are going to be gathering baby items to give to a refugee woman named Dianne. Peace/Witness will provide the larger items such as a crib, car seat and other larger items. They would like for the congregation to provide smaller items such as clothing, diapers etc.

Trustee Commission

The church office project is finished except for the exterior. The siding will be installed in approximately two weeks. The roof will be completed when the volunteers are not as busy. They will also be installing gutters and power washing the front of the building. Desks for pastors will arrive in two weeks.

A new specific list of tasks were printed for the church office custodian, Terry Regehr, which has been shared with him.

The Trustees have insurance valued at \$170,000.00 for the church office building and \$30,000.00 for the contents.

One of the compressor units for the air conditioner unit at church needs to be replaced. The cost for that is \$18,500.00. It can wait until spring to replace. A water filtration system is going to be installed at church at a cost of \$1,500.00.

The fundraiser fish fry will be on Sunday, October 15. The potluck committee will be assisting.

There will be an open house for the church office sometime in November. They might try to do it the same weekend as the Moundridge Christmas Open House, which is November 18.

The Sexton added 2 graves in the cemetery, Marlo Gehring and Nelson Goering.

Pastor Derek

He is trying to get sponsors for a Middle School youth group. He is also looking to find one person to lead the group.

Pastor Derek shared that he is excited about Discipleship Groups beginning. He designed bookmarks for the groups which will be in the bulletins on Sunday.

Pastor Dianne

The book of Philippians will be used as a focus during the month of October.

There will be a guest speaker from Mennonite Mission Network on October 15.

November 5 has been designated as Mission Sunday. West Zion and First Mennonite Church of Christian will be joining us for that Sunday. Pastor Brad Roth from West Zion will be the speaker. A meal prepared by the FEWZ youth group will be served at noon. Bob and Sandra Tolle will also be there with their Albuquerque Service Adventure group that Sunday.

With the resignation of Keith Schrag, the Moderator Elect position still needs to be filled. Kyle spoke with Gifts Discernment about this. They are having a difficult time filling positions. They have been getting a lot of nos.



Schrag to speak at SMCHA banquet

The Swiss Mennonite Cultural and Historical Association will hold its annual banquet October 26, 2017 at Eden Mennonite Church, 401 18th Ave., Moundridge, KS. The speaker for the program will be Dale Schrag of North Newton, KS. The title of his message will be "Searching for a Usable Past."



Dale Schrag recently retired (2014) from a position as director of church relations and campus pastor at Bethel College, North Newton, Kansas. Dale graduated from Bethel College with a degree in history in 1969. After two years of voluntary service in Arvada, Colorado, he taught high school history for two years in McPherson, Kansas. He served as a librarian in various capacities at Wichita State University, Wichita, Kansas, for nine years (during which time he and his family were active members of Lorraine Avenue Mennonite Church). He came to Bethel College in 1984 as director of libraries. In 1992 he was appointed director of marketing and church relations. From 1996-2002, he served part-time as secretary of the Higher Education Council of the General Conference Mennonite Church.

In addition to his bachelor's degree from Bethel, Dale holds a Master's of Library Science from Indiana University, and a Master of Arts in history from Wichita State University. To the extent that he has any historical specialty, it would focus on the sixteenth-century Anabaptist movement. Dale lectures frequently in area churches on topics related to Anabaptism.

Dale is married to Margaret (Margo) Loewen. They are members of the Bethel College Mennonite Church. They have two adult children and seven grandchildren, all of whom live within twelve miles of North Newton, Kansas. Life is good!


