

Remembering 50 years of the Relief Sale in Kansas: In 1974 the Quilt and Comforter Committee reported 208 numbered items that brought a total of \$18,096 to be used by MCC> The highest price received for a quilt was \$810. The amount sent to MCC in '74 was \$68,400.23 which was a substantial increase from the '73 donation of \$45,787.42. Sale day, April 6 of 1974 was described as "No rain but lots of wind" with the Sale held at the Fairgrounds in Hutchinson. The indoor auction was started after music by the Ebenfeld Mennonite Church Men's Quartet and words of encouragement and prayer by Pastor Paul Isaac of Bethel Mennonite Church, Inman. The outside Sale of farm machinery and miscellaneous items began at 10 AM. The 5th Annual Open House on Friday was considered a great success. The Sale went beyond expectations that's to the people who came with generosity in their hearts. Chairman Kroeker thanked people in his report with the phrase "May our Lord bless you richly as you do it 'in the name of Christ'".

Ref-u-gee: a person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape persecution, war or violence. Faced with life-threatening circumstances, refugees have no choice but to flee, leaving behind their home and community, family and friends.

Refugees who are outside their country of origin have crossed one or more borders into neighboring lands where they hope to find safe haven. Because refugees are victims of involuntary

relocation or forcible displacement, they take nothing with them except the clothes they are wearing and possibly some meager possessions; they are wrenched from their culture and community and leave family and friends.

The Peace and Witness Commission continues with assisting refugees who have resettled in Wichita. We are working with Kendra Allison, volunteer and donations coordinator with St. Francis Migration Ministries. We plan on supplying car seats for two new babies and again we are gathering baby items as well as personal items for new refugee families.

We are asking for your help with welcoming these families! On Sunday, February 18 and Sunday, February 25, we will collect baby items—diapers, toys, clothes (boys), blankets, wipes, etc.—as well as various personal items—razors, shave cream, body wash, body lotion, shampoo, deodorant, nail clippers, nail files, hand soap, brush, combs and wash cloths. Gift cards are always accepted and a card with your signature would be appreciated. You may place your items in the crib in the fellowship hall. Thank you so much for your help with our project. We want to be a presence of hope, comfort and welcome to these refugees!
