

Remembering 50 years of the Relief Sale in Kansas: The 7th Annual Relief Sale was held April 12, 1975. It was still the Mid-Kansas MCC Relief Sale at that time. Ed Reimer, chief auctioneer, commenced the auction at 9:00 a.m. after some music, opening remarks, and prayer. According to Chairman Eldo Kroeker's report, the bidding was brisk, the items were of high quality and approximately \$100,000 of receipts were received. Attitudes were great as well. "The Lord loves a cheerful giver" and you (the people who worked to put on the Sale) were most cheerful. Attendance was estimated at around 15,000 people. \$108,200 was sent to MCC. Two hundred sixty-six quilts, comforters, afghans and crocheted items were sold. As we celebrate our 50th Annual Sale may we remember the service and ministry provided by MCC around the world.

In addition to the business meeting the speaker will be Rev. Kathryn Goering Reid.



Rev. Kathryn (Kathy) Goering Reid is currently the Executive Director of the Family Abuse Center in Waco, Texas. The Family Abuse Center's purpose is to eliminate domestic violence and to prevent abuse through education and prevention activities. Kathy came to this position in July of 2009. The programs of the Center include a 64 bed emergency shelter, prevention programs working with families with small children, legal advocacy, a supportive living program and a permanent housing program. Kathy has more than thirty years of experience working in the religious community to prevention child abuse and domestic violence.

Kathy is the daughter of Oswald H. and Elaine Wedel Goering. In particular, her grandparents (Edward & Katie Wedel, Henry and Mary Goering) were inspiration and extremely important in the formation of her values and faith. While Kathy's family was Mennonite, her father moved to Illinois when she was in second grade and the family started attending the local Church of the Brethren. She graduated from Manchester College with a BA in English and taught more than 7 years in the public school system in the Chicago suburbs and in Atlanta, Georgia. First ordained in Pacific Southwest District of the Church of the Brethren in the late 1980s, Kathy began her ministry as first Director of Christian Education and later as Associate Pastor of Epworth United Methodist Church, Berkeley, CA.

In 1990, she was ordained in the Mennonite Church. For 12 years, she was a church planter in Austin, Texas (Austin Mennonite Church). At the same time, she served as the Executive Director of the Texas Homeless Network. The Texas Homeless Network built coalitions across the state and provided resources and technical assistance to homeless service providers. In 2004, she blended her passion for the caring ministries in the church with her skill in administrative and management work to become the Executive Director of the Association of Brethren Caregivers, Elgin, Illinois, until the 2008 merger of that organization with the General Board of the Church of the Brethren. For nearly a year, she was Associate General Secretary of Ministry & Program of the Church of the Brethren supervising nearly 100 employees and overseeing a nearly five million dollar budget. The ministries under supervision included: Office of Ministry, Congregational Life, Brethren Service Center, Global Mission Partnership, Brethren Press & Communications and the Caring Ministries.

Kathy is also the author of several books. (See more about books in March Eden Echoes.)
