

He is from the Democratic Republic of Congo but was forced to flee his country due to war. His family fled to Kenya, where they lived for six years before being granted permission to enter the United States as refugees.

Masemo is a gifted musician and is currently attending Hesston College in the Bible and Ministry Program. He made a promise to God that if he was able to find safety in another part of the world, he would share his story and the story of so many others he left behind. He hopes his story sheds light on the realities of life in parts of Africa and that it inspires others to make a difference.
