From the Peace Witness Commission: Mark your calendars for The Black Church: This Is Our Story, This Is Our Song airing on PBS stations February 16 and 17, 2021 at 9:00 p.m. ET (check local listings.) The documentary reveals how Black people have worshipped and, through their spiritual journeys, improvised ways to bring their faith traditions from Africa to the New World, while translating them into a form of Christianity that was not only truly their own, but a redemptive force for a nation whose original sin was found in their ancestors' enslavement across the Middle Passage. While our mobility may be limited during the pandemic, we can still exercise our minds to learn more of important issues facing people in need.

The Eden Endowment committee met with the new admission of ELT and Stewardship representatives. Robert Wall from Everence Investments presented a report of the funds history to date and the performance of the last year. Our fund did very well again this year. Our fund started on 1-1-2020 with \$500,894.00. After our \$20,000.00 withdrawal for grants given out in April, the fund ended the year with \$537,071.00. We are pleased to announce the committee agreed to grant \$25,000.00 this year in April. The application process is now open, and we will be accepting them through March 7th.
