The COVID-19 pandemic has had a catastrophic impact globally on health, economic well-being and inequality. Oxfam estimates it will take more than a decade for vulnerable communities to recover. In a letter to President Biden, MCC joined other organizations in calling for increased international pandemic assistance as hundreds of

millions of people slip into poverty, more than three billion lack access to health care and many more lack the resources to recover economically.

On January 27, six senators reintroduced the Support for Global Financial Institution Pandemic Response Act (S. 67). Many vulnerable low-income countries lack the resources to cope with COVID-19 and a global economic downturn. This bill would direct the International Monetary Fund to assist by freeing up reserve assets at no cost to U.S. taxpayers. Ask your senators to support a robust financial international response to the global pandemic.
