Note from the Pastor

Your steadfast love, Lord, reaches to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds. Your righteousness is like the highest mountains, your justice like the great deep.

Psalm 36:5-6

My recent sabbatical offered me the gift of time to spend in God's remarkable creation. I have always loved the mountains, so traveling for almost a month to the northwest to explore five national parks with mountains was perfect. Some peaks were rugged with sharp cliffs, some had more rounded tops (dormant volcanoes) and others had glaciers hugging the slopes and crevasses. The valleys between these mountains were filled with vibrant blue- and emerald-colored lakes, flowing streams, gushing waterfalls, meadows of flowers, and thick forests. And overhead the skies full of magnificent cloud formations. What an array of God's glory!

What drew my attention on this trip was the trees! I was in awe walking through a forest of trees where some of them were 1,000 years old. The Western Red Cedars and Douglas Firs towered high above us growing more than 200 feet tall reaching straight up toward the sun. Their grandeur and longevity were inspiring, reminding me of God's steadfast love and faithfulness, which reach to the heavens.

The massive trees in the temperate rain forest that we visited were draped in mosses and a diverse array of plants flourished on the forest floor. Some large trees had fallen but, in that ecosystem, those decaying "nurse" logs provide minerals, moisture and warmth for new seedlings to take root and grow. Youth and age are intertwined together. Underneath the ground there is a vast network of fungi that interconnect with the tree roots which help the trees thrive. In the same way, we in the church grow and thrive as we are nourished by our connection with each other and with our creator God.


