While there, Jay was instrumental in getting one of his students, John Muthama, to Bethel to gain a degree in biology. During his time in Kansas, John stayed with Jay's parents, J Hobart and Lorene Goering and attended Eden with them. John won many track awards both locally and nationally as a Bethel athlete. He graduated in 1977 and returned to Kenya where he taught biology in various secondary schools and also was involved in administration.

John's daughter, Ann Mbugua, would like to get a Social Work degree here in the United States and return to Kenya to help disadvantaged people in her own country. She is an intelligent, outgoing young woman who will want to get to know all who support her. She would like to begin spring semester in 2024. She has been accepted at Bethel College, North Newton, and will need some resources to complete her degree. She will need \$8,000 to \$9,000 per semester. The "Ann Mbugua Education Fund" has been set up at the Citizens State Bank in Moundridge, Kansas.
