"The Reformer" is a movie about Ulrich Zwingli, a priest in the Reformed Grossmunster Church in Switzerland, who opened scripture to the common person. The movie opened in Switzerland in 2019. The movie is seen through the eyes of his wife, Anna. Zwingli is quoted, "To be a Christian does not mean chattering about Christ, but rather to lead a life as Christ lived." Anna is caught between the doctrines of Catholic Church and what she reads in Scripture.
