"Life in the Face of Death" is an article by Heidi Regier Kreider, WDC conference minister, in the WDC weekly newsletter. "Last week was the anniversary of 9/11, the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks that killed nearly 3,000 people. Along with that grim memory, the past week continued to bring new reports of death daily with bombing in Ukraine, starvation in Gaza, brutal civil war in Sudan, school shootings in Minnesota and Colorado, and the assassination of a prominent activist. Closer to

home, we grieve the deaths of beloved members of our families, congregations and communities. Some have died peacefully after a long and full life, while other lives have been unexpectedly cut short by tragedy, illness or accident. Death is a mystery beyond our understanding. ..."
